RECOMMENDATION:

RECOMMENDATION TO ADOPT RESOLUTION 027-2023 APPROVING AN AMENDMENT TO THE AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF HAWAIIAN GARDENS AND THE SOUTHEAST LOS ANGELES COUNTY WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT BOARD TO CONDUCT AN FY 2023-2024 "YOUTH@WORK" PROGRAM FROM JULY TO DECEMBER 2023 AND TO ADOPT THESE FUNDS INTO THE FY 2023-2024 CITYWIDE BUDGET

SUMMARY

The Southeast Los Angeles County Workforce Development Board (SELACO WDB), under Agreement 106008, has awarded the City Of Hawaiian Gardens an allocation and program budget for the Youth@Work Program for Phase I period of July to December 2023. The Youth@Work program provides training and work experience for youth of our community. The SELACO board has approved the allocation of 74 slots with \$275,502 of program funding to be dedicated to the City of Hawaiian Gardens for this phase. SELACO will review the programs at the end of the period and may extend the time for Phase I or allocate additional funds for a Phase 2 period of January to June 2024. Another amendment will be brought to Council if additional funds are allocated for Phase 2.

JULY TO DECEMBER 2023 PROGRAM:

The program period is from July 1, 2023 through December 31, 2023. The participants for the allotted slots will meet the characteristics matrix set by the county as follows;

Cal Work TANF: 19
Other Underserved Youth (OUSY): 39
System Involved Youth (SIY): 10
JJPC/Probation : 6

The program is available to Hawaiian Gardens residents who qualify under one of the eligibility categories. All participants will receive a minimum of 140 hours of work experience and 20 hours of personal enrichment training. Participants will be paid \$16.90 per hour.

FISCAL IMPACT

The grant provides funding to support the participant wages and training materials. Grant funds are also provided to support the administration of the program, however, the City has budgeted additional amounts from the General Fund to supplement the administration budget for these programs.
